### **Assessment Rate Notice for SFY2022**

This is the annual announcement advising you of the new assessment rate for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2022. On April 21, 2021, the Commissioner of Health set the SFY2022 Assessment Rate for the Vermont Vaccine Purchasing Program based on the recommendations of the Immunization Funding Advisory Committee.

The new monthly rate for child covered lives will be \$12.02. The new monthly rate for adult covered lives will be \$1.70. These rates will take effect for amounts due on August 15, 2021, November 15, 2021, February 15, 2022, and May 15, 2022 for the measuring months of April through June 2021, July through September 2021, October through December 2021, January through March 2022, respectively.

The first quarterly assessment at the new rate in this notice will be payable August 15, 2021. The assessment due on May 15, 2021 for the measuring months of January through April will be at the 2021 Assessment Rate of \$9.26 per child per month and \$0.96 per adult per month as set on April 21, 2020.

As advised when the SFY2021 rate was set last year, the SFY2022 assessment rate has returned to normal levels. Last year there was a one-time subsidy that created a favorable cash position reducing the assessment rate and created an expectation of an increased rate this year. For planning purposes, the best estimate at this time for the SFY2023 assessment rate is \$10.91 per child covered life per month and \$1.60 per adult covered life per month. The SFY2023 assessment rate is expected to be reviewed for final determination in April 2022.

We thank the payer community for their continued support and participation in the Vermont Vaccine Purchasing Program. We also want to express our appreciation to the Vermont Department of Health and business offices for their continued efforts to strengthen the overall accuracy of information supporting the annual VVPP assessment setting process.
